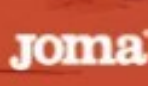

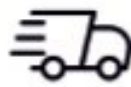

The Monks ~~~ A brief history

More than one year has been traced for the formation of HAMBLE CLUB but it is 1969 that is presently deemed to be correct. Formed as Hamble FC they made steady progress through the Southampton Junior Leagues before merging with a Sunday team, called Hamble Club and adopted their name in 1981. From the senior divisions, Hamble Club were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1993. They moved from their Mount Pleasant base to the Old College Fields and made a further move to what was then known as the Shell-Mex Ground during the 2002/03 season which remains their present home. Wessex members between 2004 and 2007, Hamble became Hampshire Premier League founders but they failed to complete the 2012/13 season and had to start a division lower. But this heralded the start of an upturn as they gained four promotions in five years, including one in their first season back in the Wessex League in 2017.

The club was established in 1969, originally as a youth team. In 1993 they joined Division Three of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Three champions in 1996/97, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with Hamble becoming members of the new Division Three. In 2006 the division was renamed Division Two, but at the end of the 2006–07 the division was disbanded and the club became founder members of the Hampshire Premier League.

Hamble pulled out of the Hampshire Premier League during the 2012/13 season. Although they were readmitted the following season, they started in the newly formed second tier of the league, Division One. The club were Division One runners-up in 2013/14 and were promoted to the Senior Division and went on to win the Senior Division in 2014/15. After finishing third the following season they were promoted to Division One and then were Division One champions in 2016/17, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

WESTBURY UNITED CLUB HISTORY

The club started in 1920 when two local sides amalgamated. Westbury Old Comrades FC had just won promotion to the First Division of the Wiltshire County League and to strengthen the side they joined forces with a local junior side, Westbury Great Western Railway XI, and together they became Westbury United Football Club.

In its first season, the Club finished third from bottom of the County league and in the 1920's they struggled, but in the 1930's they won everything possible in Wiltshire football. In 1936 the Club reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. They were led by a magnificent player called Billy Pearce, who captained the County throughout the decade. Also included in the side at the time was a prolific goal scorer called Bill Butler, who scored more than eighty senior goals in one season (including thirty in a month!).

The Club purchased and moved to its present ground in Meadow Lane in 1934, the cost of the four-acre site being £475. The very first game played on what was then the Jubilee Playing Field was against Bristol City and a crowd of around 4000 attended.

The Club has produced many players who have gone on to make the grade at professional football, two of them being centre forwards for Bristol City. The first was Reg Smith who played for City in the 1930s and was then transferred to Wolverhampton Wanderers for what was described in the Press as a 'considerable fee'.

The other was John Atyeo, who for his signature City played a presentation game against Westbury and made a donation of £100. It must have been the bargain of the century as John played over 600 games for City and scored 359 goals. He also played six times for England in which he netted five goals. He died suddenly in June 1993, aged 61, and now has a grandstand named after him at City's Ashton Gate ground as well as a street in his home village of Dilton Marsh (just a few miles from Meadow Lane).

The Club has strong family traditions. Wilf Alford left Westbury before the last War to play for then First Division Portsmouth. His son, Phil, managed the Reserve Team for many years as well as stints helping at First Team level, while his grandsons have also played for the Club.

Westbury joined the Western League in 1984 and initially struggled. In 1988 floodlights were erected and Southampton were the visitors for the official switch on. Season 1988-89 saw the Club win its first honour in the League, winning the Sportsmanship Trophy. In 1991, under the management of Ian Harris, they won the First Division Title to gain promotion to the Premier Division. The highest League placing to date came in the 1994-95 season when they finished fifth.

The Club has had its share of dedicated officials who have given a lifetime of service. Former Club President, Ernie Barber, who passed away in December 2012, used to carry the team kit as a seven-year-old (1933) and after the war he started playing. When he finished playing, he became Secretary and held the post until the end of the 1996-97 season when he decided to retire.

With the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, been able to replace the drainage system on the pitch as well as erect fencing around the ground and a wall around the pitch. Following several seasons in the 2000s where the aim of promotion to the Toolstation Premier League wasn't achieved, long standing manager Paul Brickley stood down and there was 6 seasons of struggle from 2010/11 till 2015/16 under various managers with the team finishing in the bottom 3 every time!

There were major changes behind the scenes with the aim of driving the Club forward. Although the team finished bottom of the league in 2014-2015 we were reprieved from relegation and made a minor improvement in 2015-2016.

The 2015/16 season had a similar theme, Westbury were facing down the barrel of another relegation battle and another manager was relieved of his position. This change brought in the current father/son management team Neil and Joe Kirkpatrick, a strong finish to the season meant Westbury finished with a satisfactory 58 points and a 12th position finish.

The Kirkpatrick's had attracted a strong group of players and Westbury started the season amongst the favourites to be promoted. They started the season well, staying unbeaten for the first 13 league games, winning 8 and drawing 5. Chairman Matt Bright stepped down in early October to spend more time with his family, and Secretary Greg Coulson was elected to become Chairman at a Special General Meeting in early November. The club won the First Division and secured promotion to the Premier Division. They managed to score more points (95, previous best 91), score more goals (97, previous best 95) and concede the least goals (29, previous best 39) in the clubs history.

2018/19 was Westbury's first season back in the Toolstation Western Premier League since relegation in 2002, they finished fifth with another record points haul for the club. The 2019/20 season was brought to a premature end due to the Covid-19 pandemic; the club took this opportunity to make changes in the management department, Lewis Porter and Ricky Hulbert took over to continue the great work that had been carried out by the Kirkpatrick's before them.

2020/21 was another season curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the club concentrated on investment in the facilities, carrying out a lot of maintenance around the ground and investing in the pitch to make sure Meadow Lane looked better than it had done for many years, Ricky and Lewis were integral to this improvement driving the clubs' standards to the next level ready for the start of the 2021/22 season.

FA reorganisation of the football pyramid saw Westbury moved laterally into the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division for 2021/22, along with several other local clubs (Calne, Corsham and Bradford on Avon), which resulted in a large reduction in travel for league matches. The team had a superb season which resulted in finishing in runners up spot behind Bishops Cleeve and with it promotion to the Southern League, and the club now playing at their highest ever level.

At the beginning of the 2022/23 season, chairman Greg Coulson stepped down and was replaced by Sam Gooding. The season saw the club finish in its highest position in 103 years of 10th in the Southern League and lifted the Wiltshire Premier Shield after a 3-0 victory against Swindon Town FC.

During the 2023/24 season, Phil Hampson took over the role of chairman and the start of an exciting transformation of the club began. The club has new badge which has brought a new identity to the team but continues to have a strong management team of Ricky Hulbert and Lewis Porter.

Jonny Hill – Jonny is in his 3rd season at the club and has established himself as one of the best keepers around. A calming presence who is known for his points winning saves. Jonny is a popular and big character in the changing room and around the club. He has the longest arms you will ever see, and he takes particular care over his looks, grooming himself to within an inch of his life. Previous clubs include Bradford Town, Shaftesbury, and Dorchester.

Kieran Perrin – Pezza is a new signing for us this season between the sticks and will add competition to Jonny. Kieran is waiting for an operation on a shoulder injury but has been a great addition to the changing room. A goalkeeper with great pedigree, being the son of former Yeovil Town goalkeeper Steve Perrin. Comfortable with the ball at his feet and great technical attributes. Kieran will be looking to learn from Jonny and the ex-keepers at the club, which will progress his development.

Steve Hulbert – Steve is Westbury's longest serving player, playing well over 200 games. Mr. Reliable and his versatility has been priceless for the club. Predominantly a right back these days but can play anywhere along the back line as well as in midfield if needed. The most intelligent player at the club and is a non-league football encyclopaedia. Has been known to lose his head once or twice on the pitch, unbelievable dance moves and a questionable choice in boots. Previous clubs include Frome Town, Melksham Town and Bradford Town.

Ryan Bole – Bole is in his 4th season for the club, growing into a senior member of the squad which has seen him being given the captaincy this season. A man that demands high standards of himself and everyone around him, while also giving the lads plenty of stick in the changing room. A thunderbolt of a left foot, a right foot to stand on. Hugely popular with everyone at the club and has shown incredible loyalty to the club over the past 2 seasons, turning down many offers to move on. Previous clubs include Melksham Town and Devizes Town.

Jake Hutchings – Hutch is in his 4th season with the club, being the managers' first signing when they took over. A classy, ball playing centre half who loves to defend but also has the ability to play any range of passes. Hutch missed last season with an injury that has kept him out for 12 months. He is on his way back to fitness; we are all hoping to get him back sooner rather than later. Another popular member of the changing room, he is the designated DJ which no one else has been able to step up to since he's been injured. Signed from Melksham Town.

Dan Restorick – A new signing this season after a few seasons in The Southern League with Paulton. Dan is a big centre half who is comfortable on the ball and his fitted in well amongst the lads. Has the nickname 'Burns', after his resemblance to Dan Burn, apparently. Previous clubs include Paulton and Larkhall.

Sean Keet – Keets was signed last season from Corsham Town and had a huge impact when he came into the club. A no nonsense, physical centre half who loves defending more than anything, a monster in the air and is never shy in a tackle. Keets and his partner are expecting their first child this season. Previous clubs include Corsham Town, Bradford Town, Bitton and Oldland.

Aaron Cockerill – Azza has been a fantastic signing for the club since he came in at the start of the 22/23 season. Originally coming in as a left back, Azza has converted into a top centre half, being our standout player last season. Aggressive in his defending and comfortable on the ball, as well as being huge in the changing room, he has become a massive part of the club. Another player who keeps his own standards very high and sets the example to the others around him. Questionable choice in music. Previous clubs include Warminster Town and Shepton Mallett.

Ben Griffiths – Griff is in his 5th season with the club. He missed a season with a serious knee injury but was back to his very best last season after putting himself through a huge amount of rehab to get back on the pitch, which is a credit to him and his determination to get back playing. Griff can operate both in central midfield and at right back. A lovely player to watch on the ball, with quality in everything he does. Has been through the academy system and is a former Welsh international youth player. Previous club is Frome Town.

Ben Ashfield – Ben is a new signing this season after returning from living and playing in America for 5 years. He has impressed with his wonderful passing range and work rate since coming into the club. Ben is a quiet lad off the pitch but has a very good footballing brain, we're expecting big things from him this season. Previous club University of Colorado Springs.

Ashton Shanley – Ashton is in his 4th season for the club, playing over 100 games. A midfielder player that loves getting on the ball, he gets the ball moving and has a with a wand of a right foot. The main man in the changing room, class clown who always gives as good as he gets, usually gives way more. A great bloke who is vital to us on and off the pitch. Previous clubs include Bradford Town and Corsham Town.

Will Thomson – Will is fantastic midfielder player, who has an ability to skip around tackles and move with the ball like very few we've ever seen before. He has had his injury problems over the last couple of seasons but looks back to his best now and has been excellent coming into the season. He's in his 5th season with the club and is now a senior member of the squad. Quite often the butt of the jokes but takes it well. He doesn't have a comeback in him so he kind of has to! Will is an account apparently, but we've seen over the years that he can't really count. Previous clubs Melksham Town.

Joel Smedley – Smeds is a new signing to the club this summer from Corsham Town. A box-to-box midfielder with quality in abundance. Smeds is just returning from an ACL injury and after seeing what he can offer us on the pitch, we can't wait to get him back to full fitness. Has lovely teeth. Previous clubs include Chippenham Academy and Corsham Town.

Aaron Witchell – Aaron has been a long-term target for us so we were delighted to finally land him this summer. Witch can operate and full back but is mainly a midfielder player. His fitness levels and quality on the ball have impressed us this season and he is going to be vital for us this season. He has taken over from Will as the best-looking player at the club. Previous clubs include Bradford Town and Melksham Town.

Charlie Walton – Charlie missed a lot of last season for various reasons and he was missed by us massively. On his day, he's one of the best around. Charlie has played for us as goalscoring midfielder player but has been pushed higher this season and has thrived in his new role. A great guy off the pitch and a winner on the pitch, we are all really excited to see Charlie back out there for us this season. Previous clubs include Warminster Town and Bradford Town.

Marcel Lewis – Marcel is a new signing this season from Chippenham Academy and has grabbed the opportunity with both hands. Marcel has pace with the ball, goals and assists in him and incredible work rate. An exciting player with a great attitude, who will get fans on the edge of their seat this season. Previous clubs include Chippenham Academy, Melksham Town and Welton Rovers.

Ed Butcher – Ed is a massive new signing for us this season, coming in from Paulton. An experienced winger with pace to burn and a thunderous left foot. Ed has fitted into the group well, demanding the high standards from others that he expects from himself. Previous clubs include Paulton and Tiverton.

Bevan Cross – Bevan's 2nd season at the club after coming in last season. Bev is a hardworking wide player who has stepped up his levels this season, scoring plenty of goals during pre-season. He has a great attitude and a determination to improve. Bevan has come out of his shell during his time at the club and will give the lads back as much as he gets in the changing room. Still haven't seen him crack a smile though. Previous clubs include Chippenham Academy and Bristol Manor Farm.

Joe Beardwell – Joe is another new signing for the club this season and we are expecting big things from him. A huge personality that has already become a very popular player in the changing room. A physically strong, fast striker that works really hard for the team and can score all types of goals. Thick Bristol accent, just like Keets. Large. Previous clubs include Mangotsfield and Bitton.

Harvey Flippance – Harv is in his 3rd season with the club, scoring plenty of goals along the way. He's a strong striker who links play and is lethal in the box. Another great personality in the changing room who sets his own physical standards. Has a bromance with Ashton. Previous clubs include Melksham Town and Calne.
