# The Monks ~ ~ A brief history

More than one year has been traced for the formation of HAMBLE CLUB but it is 1969 that is presently deemed to be correct. Formed as Hamble FC they made steady progress through the Southampton Junior Leagues before merging with a Sunday team, called Hamble Club and adopted their name in 1981. From the senior divisions, Hamble Club were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1993. They moved from their Mount Pleasant base to the Old College Fields and made a further move to what was then known as the Shell-Mex Ground during the 2002/03 season which remains their present home. Wessex members between 2004 and 2007, Hamble became Hampshire Premier League founders but they failed to complete the 2012/13 season and had to start a division lower. But this heralded the start of an upturn as they gained four promotions in five years, including one in their first season back in the Wessex League in 2017.

The club was established in 1969, originally as a youth team. In 1993 they joined Division Three of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Three champions in 1996/97, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with Hamble becoming members of the new Division Three. In 2006 the division was renamed Division Two, but at the end of the 2006–07 the division was disbanded and the club became founder members of the Hampshire Premier League.

Hamble pulled out of the Hampshire Premier League during the 2012/13 season. Although they were readmitted the following season, they started in the newly formed second tier of the league, Division One. The club were Division One runners-up in 2013/14 and were promoted to the Senior Division and went on to win the Senior Division in 2014/15. After finishing third the following season they were promoted to Division One and then were Division One champions in 2016/17, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

# Club History: Andover New Street ~ The Street

New Street Football Club was started in the early 1890's by the vicar of St. Mary's church Rev. (later Canon) E.R. Braithwaite. New Street in those times was the working-class part of Andover with the church and the large town houses of the middle classes at the top end, the Newbury Road turnpike at the bottom end and open fields on either side of its length. In fact the team's first pitch was on Farmer Dance's field which is now called Dances Close off New Street. Rev. Braithwaite, a keen temperance man was looking for a way to keep the young men of New Street out of the several pubs, ale houses and bottle shops found there. He came up with the idea of a football team and the only qualification required was that the player had to live in New Street. The team was successful and lasted until the 1950's when unfortunately it folded but was resurrected in 1961 and continues to this day. When the Wessex League was formed in 1986, several clubs left the Hampshire League and New Street were promoted to Division One. They finished bottom of Division One in 1989-90 and were relegated to Division Two. The following season saw the club relegated again as they finished second-from-bottom of Division Two. However, they were Division Three runners-up in 1991-92 to secure an immediate promotion back to Division Two. The club finished as runners-up in Division Two the following season and were promoted back to Division One. From then on the club continued to battle near the bottom of the league until last seasons celebrated campaign. New Street has had several homes over the years and moved to their present site at Foxcotte Park in 1992. In this year a local youth football club GVM Arken was invited to become their youth section and New Street Youth F.C. came into existence. Recognition of the club's commitment to the local community came when in April 2005 we were granted F.A. Charter Standard Community Club status the highest accolade a football club can achieve. In 2012 and 2016 we were named as Hampshire F.A.'s Community Club of the Year. Andover New Street FC has a long history of providing football specifically for Girls with a Ladies' team starting in 1995. In 2012, Footy4Girls was created by Simon Dewhurst, a football group that was for any girl that wanted to play. The group grew steadily during 2012 with around ten 8-11 year olds attending on a regular basis. Footy4Girls has continued to grow with each week seeing 40 plus girls training and playing matches and four sides in the Winchester Leagues. Always community-minded in 2005 a few of our coaches went into Icknield School for children with severe learning difficulties to run weekly coaching sessions. These were so enjoyable and successful that our inclusive group Streets Ahead was formed two years later to enable youngsters or adults with physical or learning difficulties, who love to play football, but are unable for a variety of reasons to take part in mainstream clubs, to participate in the game. Gradually the club has developed in size and has become a leading force in providing football experiences for all. 2 years ago Streets Ahead celebrated its 10th anniversary. The club now look forward to the challenges of the coming season in the Velocity Wessex League Premier Division.

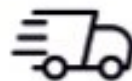
