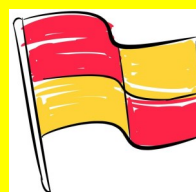

The Monks ~ ~ A brief history

More than one year has been traced for the formation of HAMBLE CLUB but it is 1969 that is presently deemed to be correct. Formed as Hamble FC they made steady progress through the Southampton Junior Leagues before merging with a Sunday team, called Hamble Club and adopted their name in 1981. From the senior divisions, Hamble Club were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1993. They moved from their Mount Pleasant base to the Old College Fields and made a further move to what was then known as the Shell-Mex Ground during the 2002/03 season which remains their present home. Wessex members between 2004 and 2007, Hamble became Hampshire Premier League founders but they failed to complete the 2012/13 season and had to start a division lower. But this heralded the start of an upturn as they gained four promotions in five years, including one in their first season back in the Wessex League in 2017.

The club was established in 1969, originally as a youth team. In 1993 they joined Division Three of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Three champions in 1996/97, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with Hamble becoming members of the new Division Three. In 2006 the division was renamed Division Two, but at the end of the 2006–07 the division was disbanded and the club became founder members of the Hampshire Premier League.

Hamble pulled out of the Hampshire Premier League during the 2012/13 season. Although they were readmitted the following season, they started in the newly formed second tier of the league, Division One. The club were Division One runners-up in 2013/14 and were promoted to the Senior Division and went on to win the Senior Division in 2014/15. After finishing third the following season they were promoted to Division One and then were Division One champions in 2016/17, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

AFC Stoneham enter the 2024/25 season with more than 130 teams and 1600 players. The Club was founded in 1919 as the Royal Engineers (Ordnance Survey Office) FC by soldiers returning from the First World War, although there is a record of matches being played by Ordnance Survey Royal Engineers against The Gentlemen of Tenby in 1888. The club joined the Southampton Junior League in 1919 and began a long association with the Civil Service Ground. Nicknamed 'The Mapmakers', it's believed they merged with the Post Office Team when they moved to the Civil Service Ground and formed a new club, Southampton Civil Service, in 1923/24 and finished fourth in the West Division. The Royal Engineers (OSO) split from the Civil Service side the following year with no automatic entry to the Hampshire County Division to the frustration of both clubs. The Royal Engineers (OSO) and Southampton Civil Service continued to use the Civil Service Ground and developed a rivalry in the Western Division with the ascendancy shifting one way and then the other. The club simplified its name in 1929 to Ordnance Survey. Success became hard to come by although the reserves won the Southampton Junior 'B' Cup in 1937. The club switched to Sunday Football from 1960 to 1966 then returned to Saturday's re-joining the Southampton Junior Division 8. The club swiftly worked their way through the junior ranks and achieved promotion to the Premier Division for a short period in 1973. The club won the Senior Division One title twice in 1982/83 and 1992/93, and the Reserves lifted the Junior 'A' Cup in 1993.

The club grew in size from that year with a 3rd XI and a veterans XI being formed. The first team won the Premier Division of the Southampton Senior League in 1996/97 which took them back into the county fold. The club just missed what should have been a unique treble, each time they have joined the league in their own right they have finished runners-up in their first season. In both the 1921/22 and 1924/25 seasons this feat was accomplished but they were just two points short of repeating this in 1997/98. However, this was put right the following season as they finished runners-up to Clanfield in 1998/99 and gained promotion to the newly formed Hampshire League Division One.

By now the club had realised that a stable future lay in the hands of young players and set up a youth policy starting with an Under 16 side in the first year and an Under 18 side starting in 1998. This proved a great success as the U18 side won the Southampton Youth Division Three at the first attempt, gaining promotion to Division Two. Even though the 1998/99 season was a great success for the club on the field, an era ended as the Civil Service Ground was closed at the end of that season. Fortunately, with the help of the local council, 'Survey' were relocated to Lordshill Recreation Ground. The club knew that this was to be a temporary arrangement and moved to their new home ground at Stoneham Park in 2002.

The First Division of the Hampshire League proved to be too strong and the club were relegated in their first season at the higher level (1999/00). Positions of 11th, 8th, 4th, and 6th were attained before the formation of the Wessex League Third Division in 2004/05. The team finished 13th and 12th in that league before opening a new chapter in the club's history by changing its name to Stoneham in 2006. After finishing 14th in the Wessex League Second Division, in 2006/07, the club along with sixteen other teams became founder members of the newly formed Hampshire Premier League which was set up following the dissolution of the Wessex League's bottom division. During the 2007 close season the club decided to enhance its name by adding 'AFC' to Stoneham, which had an immediate effect with AFC Stoneham winning the Hampshire Premier League in the 2007/08 season and reaching the final of the league's Senior Cup, just missing out on an impressive double.

Further success followed in 2011/12, having moved again to Jubilee Park the previous season, with the Reserves completing a League and League Cup double and the U16 team winning their League for the third season in a row. The First Team also went to St Marys in the Southampton Senior Cup Final for the first time and beat Bush Hill to achieve their highest honour to date. The club also combined with Granley Rovers FC, incorporating a complete youth set up into the club which now provided football from minnows through to veterans. The success of the previous season was continued into 2012/13 with the club joining an elite list of teams who have retained the Southampton Senior Cup with a win against Brockenhurst on penalties. In 2015, the Club earned promotion to the Wessex League whilst winning the Hampshire Premier League Cup for the second time. The club finished 8th in their first season in the Wessex League Division 1. This season also saw the first Ladies team competing in Hampshire Women's Division 1.

Season 2016/17 saw us switch on our brand new floodlights on October 6th 2016. The first team ventured into the FA Vase for the first time in our history, navigating past Malmesbury Victoria and Longlevens, both from the Hellenic League,

before losing to Shaftesbury. We beat Aldershot Town 5-0 in the Russell-Cotes Cup before losing to Southern League Premier Gosport Borough 3-2 in the quarter final and went out at the same stage of the Hampshire Senior Cup 2-0 at Basingstoke Town. Our Reserves, with the emphasis now very much on developing young players from our youth system, reached the final of the Wyvern Combination Cup losing 2-1 to Southern League Petersfield Town. Our First Team finished 8th again in our 2nd season in Wessex Division 1.

Season 2017/18 saw us improve our league position to 5th whilst reaching the final of the Russell-Cotes Cup, losing to Wessex League Premier Champions Andover Town 1-0 in the final at their ground in front of over 500 people. We enjoyed memorable nights on the way to the final, winning 4-3 at AFC Portchester in the quarter final and 3-1 at AFC Totton in the semi-final. During the 2018/19 season, the first XI went 20 league games without defeat, one of only three teams at our level in the country to do so as we pushed for promotion to the Wessex Premier League. For the first time in our 100 year history we entered the FA Cup as one of the lowest ranked teams in the competition and had tremendous victories at AFC Portchester 3-0 after a replay and 2-0 at home to Evo Stick South League Westfield from Woking. Sadly, our adventure was curtailed by Cirencester Town in the next round at home in front of over 350 supporters. Prior to the Cirencester game, and as the lowest ranked team left in the competition, we had a visit from the FA Cup with many of our junior players and First Team present for photos on a memorable day which brought the club both TV and national newspaper coverage. Our first ever FA Cup adventure will live in the memory for a very long time. We finished 2018/19 with a Southampton Senior Cup Final at St Marys Stadium where we unfortunately lost 3-0 to Alresford Town. The cup run to the final saw us win at both Wessex Premier League Lymington Town and Hamble before winning a memorable semi-final against Winchester City 4-3 having been behind three times and winning in the 94th minute with a Ben Clarke goal. The club was crowned Wessex Division One champions on another memorable night at Totton & Eling where we clinched the title with a 3-3 draw having played three games in five days. The 2018/19 season was undoubtedly a fantastic one for the club allowing us to take on the challenge of the Wessex Premier League for the first time in our history.

Our first ever season in the Wessex Premier League was curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. However, we took huge positives from the season sitting 2nd in the league when lockdown determined that the season became null and void. We had already moved to our new £10m home in the January whilst still maintaining our old Chestnut Avenue ground for pre-season training and games prior to its sad closure in October 2020. The old ground will always be remembered with huge affection as the place that the club wrote our recent history and was allowed to grow and develop whilst we remain very ambitious to progress further in our new home.

Due to Covid-19, the 24/25 season will only be the club's fourth full season in the Wessex Premier League, having finished fifth in 21/22, third in 22/23 missing out on promotion due to goal difference with 95 points whilst lifting the Russell-Cotes Cup, and second in 23/24 again with 95 points but eventually succumbing to Shaftesbury in the play off final. The 23/24 season will however be remembered very fondly following a great FA Cup run that took us to the 2nd qualifying round, a club record, having beaten Melksham Town 5-1 and then Basingstoke Town, who play two tiers above ourselves, 5-4 having been 4-1 down with 40 minutes remaining, and we also missed a penalty in that time! Our exploits were rewarded with a "plumb tie" away to Yeovil Town in front of 2500 supporters on a day never to be forgotten. On the same day nine years previously AFC Stoneham had played Overton in the Hampshire League with our players paying £5 to play whilst Yeovil Town were playing in the championship v Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough in front of over 22000 fans, the magic of the FA Cup. The club enter the 24/25 season with optimism and look forward to its adult and youth sections continuing their growth and progression.

TWO rounds from gracing the hallowed turf at Wembley Stadium, it's perfectly natural to assume that players from the 16 clubs competing in this weekend's Isuzu FA Trophy and Vase quarter-finals are getting pretty twitchy right now.

So, as a football manager, the question is how do you channel those nerves, excitement, and perhaps a tinge of anxiety, into a winning mentality? Is it possible to keep emotions in check and feet on the ground?

Well, as Hartpury University manager Dr Martin Longworth told me this week, the answer is with great difficulty. Dr Longworth's entire Hartpury squad are made up of current students aged between 16 and 25 with dreams of a lasting football careers, and they're making a pretty good fist of it so far, sitting pretty on top of the Hellenic League Premier Division table on the back of a 27-game unbeaten run stretching back to September.

"It's really hard to keep a 16-18-year-old's feet on the ground when you're two rounds from Wembley and we haven't shied away from that," Dr Longwell said.

"We've made it very clear that that could happen, there's no point hiding from it – it's good motivation for us.

"Yes, you've got to take each game as it comes but, ultimately, we are potentially two rounds from Wembley."

Hartpury's two-game mission starts this afternoon when Southern Counties East League side Erith & Belvedere are the visitors to the Hartpury University Stadium they share with the Rugby Championship club of the same name.

Many people's favourites for the Vase, Dr Longwell's men have won all four of their matches 1-0 to get to this stage, could history repeat itself all the way to the semi-finals this afternoon.

In the other three quarter-final ties, Southern Counties East League play-off chasers Whitstable Town take on Whitchurch Alport, of the Midland Football League, while bookies' favourites AFC Whyteleafe, of the Combined Counties Premier South, take on United Counties League Premier North opponents Bourne Town.

Re-instated Andover New Street, reprieved by Roman Glass St George fielding an ineligible player, complete the line-up with the Wessex League side hosting United Counties League side Heanor Town, making the last eight for the first time in their history.

The Isuzu FA Trophy is just as intriguing.

Story of the season, undoubtedly, are Step 4 Isthmian League Division One South East club Sittingbourne FC. Not only are the Brickies the last non-National League club standing, but they have also won through eight ties, scoring 18 goals along the way.

During that run, Ryan Maxwell's side have beaten SIX teams on higher standing, including away at National League Southend United in the last round.

According to our friends at @FATrophyFactfile, their run to the last eight in the club's 50th FA Trophy campaign, is a competition record.

This lunchtime, Sittingbourne host National League Aldershot Town for whom a victory would equal their best Trophy performances to the semi-finals, last achieved 17 years ago.

Since the original Aldershot FC were formed 99 years ago, the club has never reached a Wembley final.

Elsewhere, the Shots' local rivals, and three times former Trophy winners, Woking, travel to National League North opponents Oxford City who are equalling their best Trophy run from four years ago.

The Hoops will be looking to make it third time lucky against Woking in the FA Trophy having twice exited the competition at the hands of The Cards in the past.

The only other National League North club still involved are looking to prevent their opponents from avenging a past Trophy defeat. Spennymoor Town travel to National League side and 1980-81 Trophy finalists, Sutton United, hoping to replicate their 3-0 victory over the Us from six years ago.

And in the only all-National League affair, Rochdale, in just their second Trophy campaign, host an Altrincham side aiming to try to lift the Trophy for the third time in the club's history.

One thing's for sure, they'll be 16 squads of players going hell for leather this afternoon in a bid to get one step closer to Finals Day on Sunday May 11.

As the great Ossie Ardiles sung during Tottenham Hotspur's FA Cup song back in 1981, 'Ossie's Going To Wembley, His Knees Have Gone All Trembly'.

If the Vase and Trophy hopefuls aren't nervous and excited enough this weekend, they'll be plenty of trembly knees on the terraces, that's for sure.

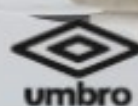
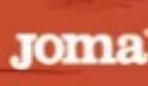

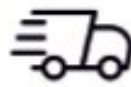
